Participation:

Pop-quizzes and in-class writing will be graded check, check-minus, or zero. These will be tallied and given an overall letter grade (equating check with A, check-minus with C, zero with F) which will count as one writing assignment.

Final Grades:

Your final semester grade will be the average of the 6 graded writing assignments plus the total grade for participation, minus any penalties for missing class (see syllabus).

How to Do Well on Writing Assignments:

1. Read the instructions on the Class Blog! Don't leave anything out (comments, links, length, formatting, sidebars, things to email me, etc.).
2. Check how your work looks when you *publish* it (not the compose space, not the preview — look at *what your readers will see*). If you're seeing code or unwanted text of any kind, get rid of it. If the layout/format looks wrong or hard to read, fix it.
3. Test your links. A broken link is worse than no link at all.
4. Write in a word-processing program first; proofread your work on paper, not on the screen.
5. Bring a printout of your work to my office hours for help with mechanics.
6. Bring a printout of your work to the BECA Writing Lab.
7. Bring a printout of your work to the LAC.
8. Bring a printout of your work to CARP.
